## Striped Dolphin

## Stenella caeruleoalba

There are some 6 dolphins belonging to the generic group Stenella (Latin caeruleus= dark blue and albus= white).

The Striped Dolphin is similar in shape and colouring to the Common Dolphin.


It is larger however, reaching 3.4m at full maturity and has



It was first recorded in New Zealand in the early 1870s when a specimen stranded at Waikanae, near Wellington. They are not common in New Zealand waters since they are essentially warmwater species widely distributed in tropical and temperate seas, seeming to prefer a deeper offshore habitat.

In New Zealand waters they feed mainly on squid and shrimps.

They have a lifespan of 40 years (male) and 46 years (female).
